NSW Ombudsman's Report

- The removal of derelict buildings;
- Additional security measures to prevent access to the site;
- Closure of Mine Road; and
- A public awareness campaign.



Derelict Mines Program

- The Derelict Mines Program has spent in excess of \$1.25 million on rehabilitation and safety works.
- Including:
 - Installation of security fences;
 - Sediment control; and
 - Water management structures.



Woodsreef Mine Major Rehabilitation Project

- Address the key recommendations of the Ombudsman's report and the most significant health, safety and environmental issues
- Containment of processed friable asbestos
- Removal of the mill, silos and administration buildings
- Comprehensive air quality monitoring program
- Health risk assessment
- Closure of The Mine Road




Work to date 2011/2012

- Actioning recommendations from the NSW Ombudsman's report
- Main demolition
 - project management
 - planning assessments
 - early tender involvement procurement process
 - environmental assessments and approvals
 - additional assessments of the Large-eared Pied Bat
- The selection of the Air Monitoring and Health Risk Assessment Consultant
- 2011/12 expenditure was \$550,000





- Planning stage
- Environmental approvals
- Early contractor involvement process
- Demolition works
- Protection for workers and others onsite
- Personal Protective Equipment
- Training
- Air monitoring for asbestos fibres



Planning Stage

- Specialist studies
 - Geotechnical assessment
 - Structural engineering assessment
 - Hazardous material identification assessment
 - Safe work procedures
 - Flora and fauna assessment
 - Additional bat study
 - Species impact study



Threatened Large-eared Pied Bat

- Flora & Fauna Assessment identified that the Large-eared Pied Bat utilises the Mill Building as a maternity roost.
- State and Commonwealth environmental approvals are now required
- A Species Impact Statement along with additional survey work is currently being completed



Demolition Works

- Undertaken in a controlled manner
- Building materials stored onsite
- No building materials will be recycled
- Draft REF avaiable for public comment at a later date



Early Contractor Involvement Process

- Open Expression of Interest
- 11 submissions received
- Shortlisted to 4 companies
- Competitive Early Tender Involvement Process
 - Site visit
 - Risk workshop
 - Review and comment on scope



Work Health and Safety

- Open class demolition licence
- Class A asbestos removal licence
- All work will be in accordance to:
 - The Work Health and Safety Regulation 2011
 - The Code of Practice for the Safe Removal of Asbestos 2011
 - The Australian Standard for Demolition of Structures



Protection for workers and others onsite

- Closed site
- No unauthorised personnel
- Decontamination facility
- PPE
 - Suitable high efficiency respirators
 - Disposal overalls
 - Protective footwear



Personal Protection



Training

- All workers will be trained
- All supervisors will be trained
- All supervisors will be nominated to WorkCover NSW



Air Monitoring for Asbestos Fibres

- Air monitoring is mandatory during demolition
 - Personal air monitoring
 - Perimeter air monitoring
 - Work vehicles air monitoring
 - Change rooms air monitoring
- Adverse air monitoring will be reported to WorkCover NSW immediately

7. Mine Road

- Department of Primary Industries, Crown Lands Division
- Role / Objective
 - Facilitate public consultation relating to the closure of the road
- Process
 - Advertise in local paper 14 July
 - Written to landholders, identified as being potentially effected
 - Closing date for submissions is 15 August
 - Submissions are forwarded to Tamworth Regional Council for consent
 - Crown Lands will forward the decision to the Minister for Lands for final determination
